

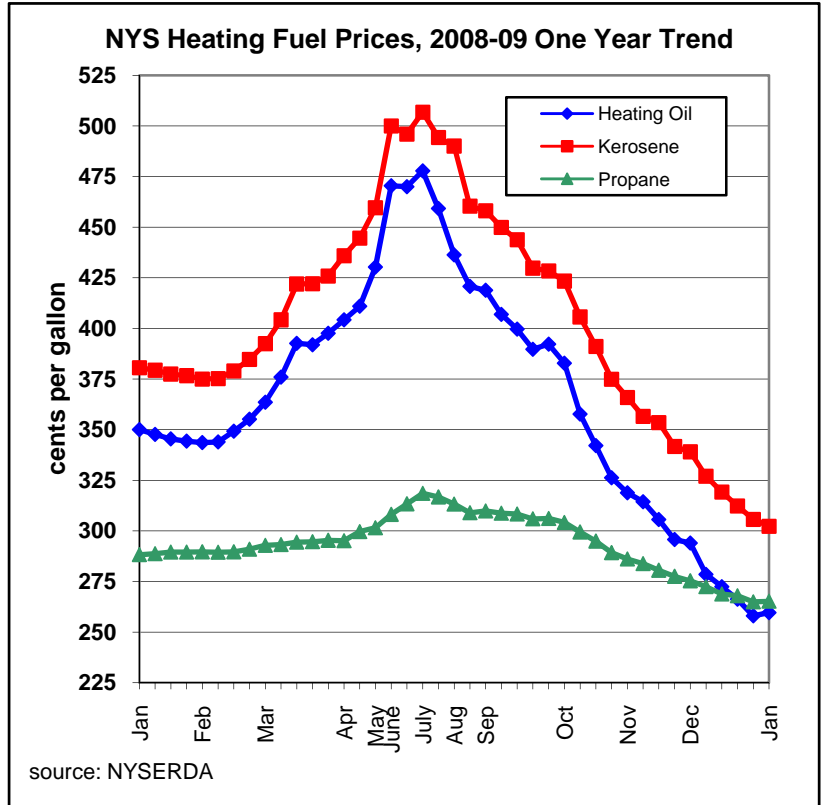
NYSERDA HEATING FUELS REPORT January 5, 2009

The Governor's Heat Smart NY Interagency Task Force - Rising energy costs may make this winter's heating bills much higher than in recent years. To prepare for this reality, Governor David A. Paterson called for the formation of an interagency taskforce, designed to bring together the agencies that provide the programs and services that families struggling to afford their home heating bills rely upon. By coordinating efforts, the agencies that make up the Governor's Heat Smart NY Interagency Task Force hope to simplify the process of finding assistance and unite resources under one direction and theme, Heat Smart NY. www.heatsmartny.org

Retail Petroleum Prices – On a statewide basis in the past week, prices increased 1.6¢/gallon (0.6%) to 259.6¢/gallon for heating oil, and 0.3¢/gallon (0.1%) to 265.2¢/gallon for propane, but decreased 3.4¢/gallon (1.1%) to 302.3¢/gallon for kerosene. Compared to a year earlier, prices decreased 90.4¢/gallon (25.8%) for heating oil, 78.3¢/gallon (20.6%) for kerosene, and 23.0¢/gallon (8.0%) for propane.

Crude Oil Prices – For the week ending 1/5/09, WTI crude oil spot prices averaged \$41.07/bbl, an increase of \$8.09/bbl (24.5%) from the week-ago average of \$32.98/bbl. WTI prices are now \$57.10/bbl (58.2%) below the year-ago weekly average of \$98.17/bbl. The all-time weekly average high of \$142.52/bbl occurred on 7/04/08.

Spot Natural Gas Prices – For the week ending 1/5/09, Henry Hub natural gas spot prices averaged \$5.658 per million Btu (mmBtu), an increase of \$0.253/mmBtu (4.7%) from the prior week level of \$5.405 /mmBtu. Prices are currently \$1.925/mmBtu (25.4%) below the year-earlier weekly average of \$7.583/mmBtu.



Residential Natural Gas Prices – NYS average prices in October 2008 were \$1.812/therm, a decrease of \$0.338/therm (15.7%) from the prior month of \$2.149/therm but \$0.038/therm (2.1%) more than the year earlier average of \$1.774/therm.

Historic Retail Prices – Statewide average high and low prices since Sept. 1997 for #2 & propane & Sept. 2000 for kerosene.

- Heating oil – highest price 477.8¢/gallon on 7/14/08, lowest price 87.6¢/gallon on 9/08/98.
- Propane – highest price 318.5¢/gallon on 7/14/08, lowest price 107.2¢/gallon on 9/20/99.
- Kerosene – highest price 506.8¢/gallon on 7/14/08, lowest price 130.9¢/gallon on 9/09/02.

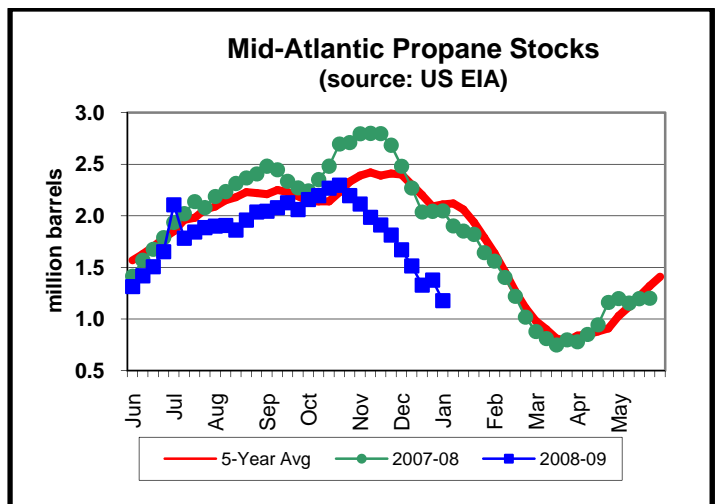
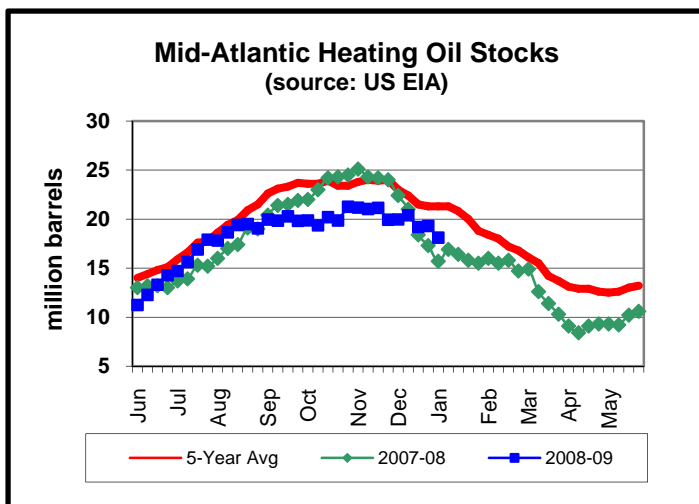
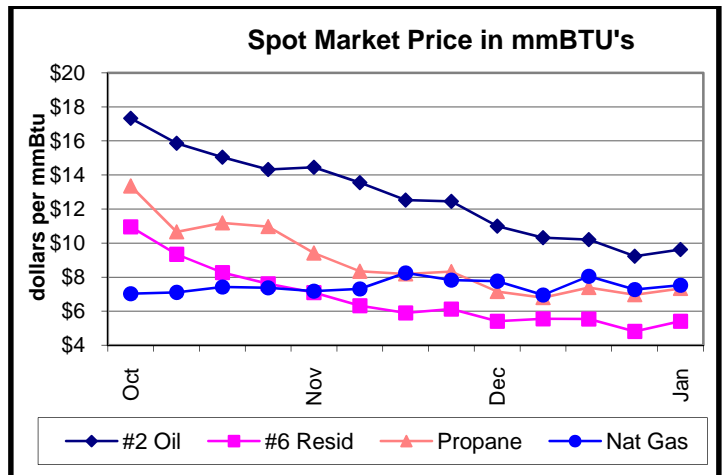
Heating Degree Days – On a statewide basis during the past week, the number of heating degree days (243) was 5.7% above the year-ago level (230) but was 5.8% below the normal trend (258). On a cumulative basis, current year heating degree days (2,224) surpass the year-ago level (2,015) by 10.4% but trail the normal trend (2,233) by 0.4%.
